



- Lay the foundation for successful watershed planning




Convening & facilitating watershed groups



□ Logic Models- why?




Program Action - Logic Model

- What does this mean?



Participatory Research

- Engagement in Watershed assessment
 - Monitoring
 - GIS analysis
 - Modeling
- Defining problem
- Reviewing and approving data sources
- Providing data
 - Historical data, community values
- Joint fact-finding (equal access to info)



Working with Experts: Focused Discussion Method

■ Level 1 – Clarification

- “Are there any questions about points of fact or clarification?”

■ Level 2 – Reflection

- “How do you feel about what you just heard?”

■ Level 3 – Interpretation

- “How does the information just presented affect the issues at hand?”

■ Level 4 – Action

- “Based on what you just heard, what needs to happen?”

Monitoring progress
